2. Course Structure:

In addition to including the graduation thesis as a zero-credit compulsory course, graduate students are required to complete at least 24 credits (with a passing score of 70 points) prior to graduation, including six required credits ("Research Methods" and "Thesis Writing"), and at least 18 credits.
