3. Course Selection Instructions

- (1) In addition to completing 128 credits, students of the English department must participate in the preparation and performance of the English graduation drama performance.
- (2) Students of the English department should take at least 74 basic module credits, core module, and professional module courses offered by the English department, including 27 basic module course credits, 27 core module course credits, and 20 professional module course credits. Students in the Teaching and Applied Linguistics module courses are also required to complete 4 course credits in a single second foreign language according during the same academic year.
- (3) Students in major module A (Literature and Culture), must complete 4 credits in a second foreign language during one academic year. These 4 credits will be counted as free elective credits. Students in major module B (English Teaching and Applied Linguistics) must complete an additional 4 credits in a third foreign language during one academic year. These credits are counted among in the 20 credits of the module.
- (4) Six common courses credits are required university wide.
- (5) The basic module courses "English Listening Practice", "Advanced English Conversation" and "English Composition" are prerequisite courses. For example, students must complete "English Listening Practice (1)" before taking "English Listening Practice (2)", and so on.
- (6) Courses offered for one academic year must be completed in one academic year before they can be counted toward graduation credits. For example, you must complete "Spanish (1)" and "Spanish (2)" in order to earn 4 credits, and so on.
- (7) University wide common courses and department module courses

1. Goals

- (1) To develop students' English listening, speaking, reading and communication skills.
- (2) To cultivate English foreign language talents with humanistic quality and international outlook.

2. Course Selection Guidelines

- (1) Non-English department majors may take English department courses beginning in the second year through the first semester of the last year (excluding the extension of the study period).
- (2) The application for elective auxiliary departments should be submitted by the required date, and approved by the chairmen of both the auxiliary department and the English department. Official approval to take supplementary courses is required.
- (3) The elective courses of the auxiliary department shall not be the same as major courses; the courses of the auxiliary department shall be regarded as elective subjects; course credits do not count toward graduation unless they have been approved through the proper channels.
- (4) Students taking supplementary courses will pay additional fees. Those who fail to pay within the time limit will have their qualifications for supplementary courses cancelled. Those who have extended their years of study due to the study of auxiliary departments should pay the credit fee if fewer than nine credits are taken.
- (5) Students who study in a supplementary department and fail to complete the credits of the courses required by the supplementary department within the prescribed period of study may apply for an extension of study for up to two years. Graduation certificates are not issued until all approved auxiliary classes are completed, even if all major related credits have been completed.

- (6) Students who study in the supplementary department and have met the graduation qualifications of the department, but fail to complete the subjects and credits of the supplementary department, may apply to the Office of Academic Affairs to waive the qualifications of the supplementary department. The application for waiver of the qualification of the supplementary department should be submitted before December 10 of the fall semester and before May 10 of the spring semester.
- (7) Students shall not be granted a supplementary withdrawal or extension after the deadline for additional withdrawal or extension on the grounds of giving up their qualifications to study in an auxiliary department. After relinquishing the qualification of an auxiliary department, course credits earned in auxiliary departments taken as elective courses must be confirmed by the chairman of the department.
- (8) For those who have completed the subjects and credits required by an auxiliary department, the name of the auxiliary department will be added to their graduation certificate and transcripts of previous years.
- (9) Completion of compulsory courses is required before elective courses may be taken.
- (10) Regarding elective courses, students must select one of the two professional modules in this department, and take 5 elective courses, totaling 10 credits.
- (11) For the "English Listening Practice" and "English Composition" of the supplementary courses, students must complete prerequisite classes before taking higher level courses. For example, "English Listening Practice (1)" must be completed before "English Listening Practice (2)", and so on.
- (12) Auxiliary department credits are additional credits for the graduation credits of the original department, and other courses cannot be credited to the auxiliary department.
